HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD

- Reading with your child at home is vital. Children who foster a love of reading, by reading at home daily with parents and carers, are proven to make greater progress and develop the wider vocabulary essential to access learning at secondary school. If possible, at least 3 times a week. Please remember to sign your child's reading record.
- It is imperative to practise spellings and multiplication tables. Your child will be expected to pass the government's Multiplication Tables Check for year 4 this year on all of their tables up to and including 12x12=144. Please use TTRockstars daily and try:

- Continue to encourage your child to develop their independence, remembering their water bottles, packed lunches and coats, as well as fastening coats and laces.
- Remind your child to hand in any letters or reply slips to their teacher.

- Practise learning on Spelling Shed, Purple Mash, TTRockstars and so on, using the log-ins sent home.
- Check Class Dojo for any messages and updates of learning.
